When I am on holiday Father Ted Wildsmith will be here. The only weekday Masses during this time will on Tuesdays and Thursdays: 11th July at 12 noon, 13th at 10 a.m. and the following week 18th & 20th at 9 a.m.

Parish Building Works:

Haile: the new Facilities building is now nearing completion-this has a sacristy, meeting room with kitchen, and an internal disability compliant toilet.

St. Ives: the lightening conductor & East Rose window restoration is now complete. Health and Safety electrical work & asbestos removal is yet to come.

Penzance: Health and Safety and fire safety work to carry out in compliance of insurance & diocesan requirements. Works also to include internal toilets & remaking of old school dining room & unused kitchen vacated in 1979. Non-fire compliance includes replacement of all downstairs lath & plaster ceilings & the installation of fire alarm system to protect the whole building. The church in Penzance is Grade II Listed and therefore nothing major can be done without advice & permission from Historic Churches and other associated bodies. You will notice a Planning notice to this effect on the main door of the church and in the Cornishman. As next year is our 175th anniversary we are including designs for 2 more stained glass windows to mark the occasion as took place for the 150th in 1993. This application also includes the addition of a more suitable Reredos panelling around the existing Lady Chapel shrine granite votive candle stand. I know some parishioners have asked for this area to be enhanced with a more dignified backdrop to Our Lady's statue. All the above exciting works completed and in hand, will be available to see in more detail at the usual parish AGM on Thursday 27th July at 7pm.

The Juan Ferrer shipwreck disaster happened on October 23rd 1963 on rocks at Boscawen Point. Only four of the 15 survived, and most bodies were shipped back to Spain. Four that were found afterwards were buried in the Catholic section of Penzance Cemetery in an unmarked grave. Last year two RNLI volunteers raised enough money to pay for a headstone. I shall be there to bless this Saturday 8 July at 11 a.m. The only surviving member will be present with other relatives of the crew. Anyone is welcome at the simple ceremony on the day.

In September I promise to come back and show you pictures and tell you stories and let you know if I have found the answer to why our world is as it is!
