**Recommended Key Mitigating Actions against Virus transmission in Churches which should continue for the time being:**

4. **Good routine cleaning after Mass**
5. **Track and trace record**

**Church Leaders warn of critical moment to avoid climate catastrophe. Pope Francis, Ecumenical Orthodox Patriarch Bartholomew, and Archbishop Welby** have jointly warned of a 'critical moment' regarding the urgency of environmental sustainability, its impact on poverty and the importance of global co-operation. They said: 'For more than a year now we have all experienced the devastating effects of a global pandemic –all of us, whether poor or wealthy, weak or strong. We have depended on each other in our efforts to stay safe.' Their statement calls on people to pray for the world leaders ahead of Cop26, for individuals to make sacrifices for the sake of the planet, and for business leaders and company bosses to lead "the transition to just and sustainable

economies." Their joint declaration also issued a clear warning: "this is the first time that the three of us feel compelled to address together the urgency of environmental sustainability, the impact on persistent poverty, and the importance of global co-operation. Today we are paying the price... tomorrow could be worse.

#### **Season of Creation, from 1<sup>st</sup> September to 4<sup>th</sup> October.**

This is an opportunity to review our practical and personal response in what we are doing to care for our Common Home, and to celebrate the gift of God's beautiful Creation. It is also true that if we ignore the well-being of our planet, we assist the evils of our day which undermine the dignity of the human person – poverty, hunger, social isolation, economic deprivation, human trafficking and modern slavery. Following the G7 the UN Climate Change Conference COP26 will take place in Glasgow in November, and will be addressed by the Holy Father. This year then, we have become more conscious of the needs of our planet and its peoples. In April our diocesan Environmental policy was issued. So, step by step, we are seeking that conversion of heart which is so necessary to recognise more fully God as Creator of all that is, and our responsibility to exercise sensitive stewardship of the earth which the Lord has entrusted to us.
