Care for the whole of creation: climate disasters are a warning to the world, says Pope Francis, who with the Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew, issued a joint message on 1 September. They said "environmental destruction is a sign of a morally decaying scenario in which too many people ignore or deny that from the beginning God intended humanity to co-operate in the preservation and protection of the natural environment. Our obligation to use the earth's goods responsibly implies the recognition of and respect for all people and living creatures."

It is organising a Mass Constituency –based lobby of all MP's to ask them to vote against any moves in Parliament to decriminalise. This takes place on 27/28 October. Smile Lines: A site for sore eyes.

One of your smiles of the last weeks struck a chord with me as I have often been upset by signs about cats' eyes removed. Travelling along the main coast road in Lincolnshire, my husband and I came upon just such a sign. However our minds were put at rest a little later on when we reached the beach called Mogg's Eye where, we assumed, the eyes were stored safely until they could be returned to their rightful owners!

(The story came from the fact that Suffolk County Council renamed 'cats eyes' as Studs, as children were upset about cats eyes being removed. What about teaching them what cats' eyes are, rather than renaming, so children have an understanding about where the idea came from, a man in my home town in Bradford, Yorks in 1934 Fr P.)
