Fact: Did you know? 'I know that my Redeemer liveth.'

Following on from my homily last weekend, and grateful thanks to Tony Allbright, who provided on the website the link to Isobel Baillie singing "I know that my Redeemer liveth". The link to the right also had an interview with Isobel, who spoke about that very aria from Handel's 'Messiah,' and how she never sang it 'as a concert'; it was different, and that aria she said she sang with quiet conviction; the truth of faith for her and for us.

I then got out my boxed set of LP's of Messiah, I've had since 1959, knowing that the illustration on the front cover is of the monument to Handel in the South Transept of Westminster Abbey (Poet's Corner) It is the work of the French sculptor Roubillac. Handel lies buried beneath the pavement below the monument. The composer is shown at work on 'Messiah', listening to an angel, thus representing the divine inspiration of the work. The music score is shown open at the aria, 'I know that my Redeemer liveth', an appropriate inscription for a Christian monument, Handel said, when he wrote the *Hallelujah Chorus* "I did think I did see all Heaven before me, and the Great God Himself." It was during a performance of *Messiah* at Covent Garden on 6th April 1759 that Handel was taken ill, and died 8 days later, on 14th April 1759.

Prince Philip RIP

Much has been said, shown and written this past week. Few knew much of his religious faith and thinking. He had on his own bookshelves 634 books on religion. He founded in 1966 St George's House, Windsor, as a place for frank, vigorous discussion across religious and political divides. He did write "Religious conviction is the strongest and probably the only factor in sustaining the dignity and integrity of the individual." The royal biographer Christopher Warwick wrote "He was a very religious man and very questioning when it came to religion." Here is a prayer he wrote for a book of prayers in 1998 *O Lord, the creator of the universe and author of the laws of nature, inspire in us thy servants the will to ensure the survival of all the species of animals and plants which you have given to share this planet with us. Help us to understand that we have a responsibility for them and that 'having dominion' does not mean that you have given us the right to exploit the living world without thought for the consequences. Through him who taught us that Solomon could not compare with the beauty of the flowers of the field."*
